



Brittany Rhodes

(b. late 1900s)

A Detroit native, Brittany Rhodes received her B.S. in Mathematics from Spelman College and her M.B.A. from Carnegie Mellon University. She founded Black Girl MATHgic (BGM). BGM's flagship product is the Black Girl MATHgic Box, which is the first subscription box designed to increase math confidence and decrease math anxiety in girls and black children on a 3rd-8th grade level. While BGM was in pre-launch, Brittany won the HER IDEA Pitch Competition

held at the 110th NAACP National Convention, Detroit. She also secured a \$5,000 equity-free grant from HBCUvc (Historically Black Colleges and Universities Venture Capitalists) and PledgeLA.
