



Tammy Baldwin (b. 1962)

Tammy Baldwin double majored in political science and mathematics at Smith College, graduating in 1984, and then earned her law degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1989. She became the first out lesbian elected to the House of Representatives in 1998 and then to the Senate in 2012, and she was the first female congress member from Wisconsin. Baldwin has introduced 10 bills that have become law, including

legislation on maternal care and veteran health services and benefits. She sits on the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Her legislative priorities include college affordability, health care, and veterans affairs.
