



Zaha Hadid (1950–2016)

Zaha Hadid was a British-Iraqi architect known for her avant-garde designs. Her undergraduate degree was in mathematics at the American University of Beirut. She studied at the Architectural Association School of Architecture, London (1972). In 1979, she established Zaha Hadid Architects (ZHA), London. Her projects include the Center for Contemporary Art in Cincinnati OH, the first American museum designed by a woman,

and the Guangzhou Opera House. Hadid was the first woman to win the prestigious Pritzker Architecture Prize (2004) and the Royal Institute of British Architects' Royal Gold Medal (2015). Hadid was made a Dame of the British Empire in 2012.
